


CENSUS 2021 UPDATE

TRANS COMMUNITY HEALTH PROFILE



57% UNSPECIFIED GENDER IDENTITY

18% TRANS MEN

17% TRANS WOMEN

8% ANY OTHER GENDER IDENTITY*

*This includes people with other gender identities that are different to their sex assigned at birth, such as non-binary and gender fluid

DISCLAIMERS AND CONTEXT

POPULATION SIZE

8% Of people in Birmingham did not answer the question on gender identity in the 2021 census (74,377).

10X This is almost 10 times larger than the number of people identifying as trans in Birmingham.

There may potentially have been trans individuals who chose to not disclose their gender identity on the census.



BARRIERS TO IDENTIFICATION

Some of the potential barriers faced to self-identifying as trans on the census may include:



Mistrust in government data collection




Perceived issues of safety and privacy

ONS INVESTIGATION

The ONS are undertaking more work to understand if individual responses were affected by different interpretations of the gender identity question.

DEMOGRAPHICS

DEFINING THE POPULATION

- » The question on gender identity was new for the 2021 census.
- » An individual was classified as transgender if their gender identity was different to their registered sex at birth.
- » Data in this graphic, other than population overview has excluded those with an unspecified trans identity (n=4168).
- » We recognise this may result in an underestimate of the trans population.




DISABILITY

OVERCROWDING

Household's accommodation having fewer bedrooms than required

16% Of trans people lived in overcrowded households

9% Birmingham avg. (18% trans women, 20% trans men, 7% other trans identities).

HOUSE COMPOSITION

26% Of trans people lived in 'other household types'

11% Birmingham avg. (23% trans women, 22% trans men, 37% other trans identities).
