# **Children and Families Directorate**

The Children and Families Directorate continues to implement its new structure. The senior leadership team is almost in place, with one role yet to be recruited to during May 2024.

The key service areas are:

- SEND and Inclusion
- Thriving Children and Families
- Schools and Employability
- Children and Young People's Travel Service
- Strategy, Commissioning and Transformation

The redesigned structure is being developed using the following core principles:

- Identifying and supporting early aiming to get it right first time
- Professionals and services that wrap around our children and families
- Strengths-based and relationship-based practice with our children, families, each other and our partners
- Working together with our partners across the city as one system, putting children and families at the heart of everything they do

## **Delivering Services for Our Children and Young People in Partnership**

The Council delivers services for Children, Young People and Families through its Children and Families Directorate, led by the statutory Director for Children's Services (DCS). The Children and Families Directorate delivers services such as early years support and education, including support for vulnerable learners, services for children with special educational needs and disabilities, children and young people's travel, youth and career services.

Some services for children and young people in Birmingham are delivered by other organisations on behalf of the Council, for example:

- Birmingham Children's Trust who deliver early help, children's social care and lead the
   Birmingham Youth Justice Service
- The Healthy Child Programme delivered by Birmingham Forward Steps (NHS with Voluntary Sector Provider Collaborative).

Colleagues from the Council and our commissioned services work together in partnership to support children and young people at a strategic and operational level.

All services for children and young people operate in the context of partners working together as a whole system to improve outcomes for children, young people, their families, and communities. This includes early years, schools, and post 16 education settings and of course our children, young people, parents, carers, wider families and communities.

The Birmingham Children and Young People's Partnership is the overarching strategic group that focuses on taking a whole-system approach to improving the life chances of children and young people in our city. The partnership is led by the Birmingham Children and Young People's Partnership Board which brings together the Council, Birmingham Children's Trust, NHS Integrated Care Board, NHS Providers, West Midlands Police and Birmingham Voluntary Services Council.

Our services for children and families are also coordinated within a wider context of statutory partnerships including Health and Wellbeing Board, Birmingham Safeguarding Children Partnership, Birmingham Safeguarding Adults Board, Community Safety Partnership.
