






ECONOMIC ACTIVITY



DISCLAIMERS AND CONTEXT

POPULATION SIZE

Of people in Birmingham chose not to answer the question on sexual orientation in the 2021 census (83,766).



This is 7 times larger than the number of people identifying as lesbian or gay in Birmingham.

There may potentially have been lesbian or gay individuals who chose to not disclose their sexual orientation on the census.



BARRIERS TO IDENTIFICATION

Some of the potential barriers faced to self-identifying as lesbian or gay on the census may include:





Perceived issues of disclosure, safety and privacy

DEFINING THE POPULATION

The 2021 Census did not have separate lesbian and gay options in the sexual orientation question, so the data on the populations is grouped together.
