



COUNTRY OF BIRTH DEMOGRAPHICS Nationally, 89% of people with a Nigerian only national identity were UNDER 15% born in Nigeria (90,172). 6% were **16S** 18% national avg. born in England. 5,946 people in Birmingham WORKING 82% noted Nigeria as their country AGE 63% national avg. of birth. **65 AND** MIGRATION **OVER** 19% national avg. From 2011 to 2021 around 103,607 Age data includes those with a Nigerian identity only. people migrated to England and Wales from Nigeria.

49% of those nationally who were born in Nigeria held a UK passport. 39% had a "Central and West African" passport. Only 8% of people with a Nigerian identity had a UK passport, 82% had a Nigerian passport.


91% of people born in Nigeria speak English as their main language. 1% cannot speak English well or at all.

Of people born in Nigeria living in England and Wales identify themselves as British only. 2,758 people in Birmingham have a Nigerian only identity.









POPULATION LIMITATIONS

The census data is limited and <u>does not</u> give any information on the Nigerian population who:

• Were born in the UK and have a British national identity only.

• Were born in the UK and have a British **and** Nigerian national identity.



The census data therefore is not reflective of the entire Nigerian population.

POPULATION SIZE ESTIMATES

The 2021 census was the first census which included a write in option for ethnicity for the 'Black African' ethnic group.



Some of the Nigerian ethnic group may have not provided an additional write in response.



Therefore, the number of people reporting being of Nigerian ethnicity is likely an underestimate.
