


In the 2021 Census, 6,139 people also cited Sikh as their ethnic group in Birmingham. This is 0.54% of the total Birmingham population.

61% of the Sikh community based in Birmingham noted the UK as the country of birth, compared to 60% in 2011.

33% of Sikhs in Birmingham were born in Southern Asia.

MIGRATION

Birmingham migrated to the UK.

82% of those who identify as Sikh in Birmingham hold a UK passport. Additionally, 11% have an Indian passport and 4% have no passport.




