

KEY ISSUES AND CONCERNS FOR SOUTH YARDLEY RESIDENTS

1. Crime and Safety:

Residents in South Yardley Ward have reported concerns about crime and safety, particularly around issues such as burglary, street robbery, car theft, speeding and drug-related activity.
