

Subject of the EIA	Review of Care Packages
Brief description of the policy, service or function covered by the EIA	This initiative has been ongoing since 2018. This is not a change in service delivery. There is a legal requirement under the Care Act 2014 that all packages of care must be reviewed on a regular basis, regardless of the protected characteristics of citizens or any contributing socio- economic factors. As part of the Adult Social Care review process, it is imperative to ensure that the care and support offered, meets the identified assessed needs of individuals. When a citizen's needs have changed the package of care and support can be reduced or increased, and a new support plan is developed. Adult Social Care does not take a generalised approach to any reductions or increases in care. Each package of care is assessed to identify the needs of the individual citizen. The social worker or occupational therapist will determine the level of support required. This is a continuous process, should any new information arise, the EIA will be reviewed accordingly to ensure ongoing compliance with the equality duty. A policy of reviewing care packages of itself does not lead to packages going up or down - that depends on each person's individual circumstances. What the initiative does do though is to make it more likely that a person's care package more accurately reflects their needs.
