Please describe the impact to the disability characteristic	As at the end of the academic year 22/23, a total of 5,150 children and young people were receiving transport support. Of these, over 95% will have some degree of SEND. Based on the School Census 2022/23, a total of 29,668 pupils are recognised to be receiving SEN Support and 7,607 pupils have a EHC Plan in place in the city. Some children and young people whose arrangements change may be affected. This would likely mainly affect ASD students, but we don't have the number of students with ASD. All students potentially could struggle with a change. The extent to which they are impacted negatively will vary and could depend on how they experience change.

Please describe the impact to the ethnicity and race characteristic	Birmingham's young population is 'superdiverse', with 63% of its 0-25 population being of Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic population, and 37% White ethnicity. The service does support young people with disabilities who are drawn from global majority communities. According to the school census 52% of young people with SEND are drawn from global majority communities. This means that children and young people with a disability from these communities could be affected. CYPTS does not routinely collate this information in a way that is consistent with the EIA categories. Changes to Home to School contracts through procurement on a 'like for like' basis would not adversely affect students more greatly based on their ethnicity or race and any impact would affect all students and families equally.
How will you mitigate against any negative impact to the ethnicity and race characteristic?	The service will seek to minimise disruption for children, young people and families as a result of the re- procurement exercise. In cases where the re-procurement leads to changes to transport for children and young people, arrangements will be made for children and young people to familiarise themselves with the new arrangements. Transport operators will offer 'meet and greets' with the child/young person and their parents/carers and the passenger assistant. The service will monitor whether families take up the offer of 'meet and greets' with transport operators and will offer any further assistance families need if their child's transport provider changes. There are proportionately more students drawn from global majority communities with SEND than white students and we will keep this under review

CYPTS will ensure that contracts with providers are regularly reviewed and this includes examination of whether young people with protected characteristics are impacted by any changes. CYPTS will ensure that feedback is sought from young people, parent and cares and schools to understand if young people have been impacted. CYPTS recognises that it does not collect information about protected characteristics. CYPTS will begin to collect it through the application form for transport and collate it. CYPTS will retain discretionary powers to allow changes to be made to contracts if required to support service users in our care. Contracts to be monitored with feedback sought within first 6 weeks of contract start date with and through meetings with schools throughout the academic year. All contracts with CYPTS have tools that allow effective performance management and can terminate or vary any contract if required.
