There may be an increase in the perceived fear that
	highways, footway and cycletracks will be harder to navigate. Evidence would suggest that this would not be the case, as even at reduced lighting levels the level of illumination provide would exceed that found on the majority of the UK road network, including some motorways, which are unlit.
