






Brief description of the policy, service or function covered by the EIA

The Love Your Streets (LYS) service offers a link to residents to engage and work in partnerships with local groups and elected members to establish good community working relationships where residents can get involved cleansing within their locality. The system works well and we have shown that the added value to residents and involvement has had a positive effect on the cleanliness of the city. LYS also offers partnership working with other stakeholders. Areas of concern and the main arterial highways into the city that have shopping areas the LYS offers an all-out day approach to talking the issues that present themselves this can be waste presented from the flats above the shops or the contractual arrangements from shops and businesses with reference to their waste. The All-out day brings in partners such as: • Street scene • Housing • Waste enforcement • Fire Service • Police • Local resident groups Elected members
Highways
Other partners as required. This multi-agency approach deals with all of the issues that are presented at the given area being visited. It deals with the duty of care from ship owners, graffiti, Flytipping, issues on housing land, vermin control, street furniture. The LYS offer following these all-out days it to give bags tools and equipment for residents to be able to continue with the good work carried out and any litter picking groups that generate bags of waste from their exercise's street scene will remove the waste. LYS also offers tools and equipment to local resident groups, friends of parks and open spaces, elected member community groups and other stakeholders throughout the city. Bags litter pickers and some other hand tools are distributed amongst the groups to carry out their own cleansing in the places where're they live and enjoy the open spaces. The LYS also distributes specific sack for the waste and litter to be collected in and once any activities are carried out Street Scene has a process to pick up the bagged waste at agreed locations to remove the waste from the highway. This proposal will see a reduction in love your streets provision, but as described above the service we provide is more of a support arrangement to enable local groups to self-service their own communities. This will mean we will still provide some support, and this will include all the required equipment for the communities to undertake such activities like litter picks and general street cleansing. In addition to this we will also be taking a resource to risk / demand methodology meaning that we will help target the areas of the greatest concern which are generally the areas of lower deprivation where the more affluent areas may









	see a reduction in support, however the necessary equipment for this community self-service model will still be available for all demographics.

The promise to residents to supply tools and equipment to be able to continue and the service will continue to pick up any waste derived from the community events.
