Emerging Small Heath Neighbourhood Forum & Plan Consultation Events Summary

26th January 2023 at 393 Coventry Road Conference Rooms

The first consultation was hosted at Conference rooms at 393 Coventry Road at the Offices of Hanif & Company Solicitors based in the centre of the Small Heath/Bordesley Green Wards. With a local presence of over 24 years, the firm provides pro bono and free legally aided advice to the community in the legal areas of crime, immigration and welfare, and is a well-known community hub.

The event was hosted from 4.30pm to 8pm, to allow for the needs of attendees with different working patterns and circumstances. A significant number of groups, community activists and residents attended. The event was also attended by Councillor Shabana Bano, Birmingham City Council NDSU representatives and representatives from AECOM who provide technical support to the project, through Locality and the government Department for Levelling Up, Housing and Communities (DLUH). Local Members of parliament Jess Phillips MP and Liam Byrne MP were invited and sent their respective apologies.

Engagement at the event took various forms, with printed maps of the wards of Small Heath and Bordesley Green displayed, for participants to discuss and engage with. The ward boundary was available on numerous print-outs, with participants able to outline on maps their own views on potential Forum boundaries. The drop-in had 3 main areas of discussion, namely: What is a Neighbourhood Plan; What should be the boundary of a potential Neighbourhood Plan Area; and What is the potential case for a Neighbourhood Plan to benefit the local area.

Long meaningful discussions were had with positive feedback, supporting the need for a Neighbourhood Plan for Small Heath, with an emphasis on unifying the issues of Bordesley Green and Small Heath. Participants completed questionnaires with boundary feedback taken and contact details to add to the growing list of interested stakeholders and residents. Local community representatives who attended included Mr Zualfiqar Hussain of the Khidmat Community Centre (Small Heath), Clarita Campbell from Bethnal Church Small Heath, and Ajmal Lone who is chair of the Friends of Small Heath Park, to name but a few. All were positive about the Plan and have joined as members.

The event was posted on the official emerging Forum website and posted on the Birmingham Live website (see links below).

31st May 2023 at Love Chaii

The drop-in event was hosted at Love Chaii at Bordesley Green St Andrews Shopping Park – which incorporates Morrisons and several major stores. The venue is located on the Coventry Road Highstreet, at the centre of one of the areas' busiest shopping hubs, and very close to Small Heath Green Lane Mosque.

The event was open to all and ran from 5:30 – 8:30pm. The event attracted a large number of businesses and organisations based on the Coventry Road. Attendees including representatives from Kingswood Solicitors, The Small Heath Somalian Alliance, The Zawiya Centre, The Khidmat Centre and Purpanat CIC – all organisations and stakeholders in and around Small Heath and Bordesley Green. The event was an opportunity for new interested parties to meet current members and explore how a neighbourhood plan could benefit the local community and local organisations. Additional feedback was also taken on boundaries and ward plans.

The event was marketed on the website of the emerging Forum and on local community radio station Unity FM.

16th June 2023 at Small Heath Library

The event was hosted at Small Heath Library which is situated in the centre of the proposed neighbourhood area and between the centres of the two respective wards of Small Heath and Bordesley Green. This public venue is accessible to the community, as well as constituting a neutral venue which is not affiliated with any particular organisation or religious, political, or community grouping, and acts as a hub for a variety of residents.

The event was a listening exercise allowing residents and stakeholders discover more about what a Neighbourhood Plan would involve, its benefits and how residents can get involved. The event was attended by representatives from Small Heath Neighbourhood Policing Team, Shreen Mahmood from Muslims Connect, Murad Khan from Small Heath based Bengali community organisation Purbanat CIC, staff from Jess Philips MP's office, and others.

The event was marketed on Twitter, Eventbrite and the librarys own website.

7th July 2023 at Small Heath Wellbeing Centre

The emerging forum team were invited to attend Birmingham City Councils planning team's 'Vision for Birmingham 2040' drop in session. We had the opportunity to discuss how the emerging Small Heath Neighbourhood Plan would feed into the wider City Plan and vice versa and how residents who attended could be involved. Those who attended were able to discuss what they wanted to see in the Council's future Vision Plan and also in the emerging Neighbourhood Plan for Small Heath.

18th August Al-Rahman Masjid

We were fortunate to be granted permission to talk at the Friday prayers at one of the Coventry Roads busiest Mosque centres. Worshippers were briefly informed of what a Neighbourhood Plan was, what it involves and how to get involved. The congregation was diverse and hosted many from various backgrounds. The talk was well-received and many present were directed toward the emerging Forum's website to find out how to get involved. The congregation hosted 320 patrons.

16th September 2023 at Bethnal Church

Representatives from the emerging Neighbourhood Plan forum were kindly invited to the Windrush Celebrations held at Bethnal Church. The team were able to give a brief presentation of the work on the emerging Forum and Plan so far and able to invite celebration attendees to get involved and give the team their views. Councillor Shabano Bano and Clarita Campbell were also in attendance and kindly contributed to the talk.

Many attendees commented on the positive work done thus far and the wider community engagement work carried out by members of the emerging Forum. Many credited how diverse groups that had not been engaged in any community engagement for some time were now starting to get involved.

28th September 2023 at the Khidmat Centre.

Emerging forum members hosted a Small Heath Neighbourhood Plan Network Mixer from 6:30 – 8:00 pm at the Khidmat Centre in Small Heath. The event was a packed evening with many residents and stakeholders in attendance. Stakeholders who attended included representatives from Veola Eco Park based on Hob Moor Road, Birmingham City Council Youth Services, BYCA, and the Salama Somalian Advice Service. The event was well received by the public and stakeholders who attended, with Councillors Shabana Bana, Councillor Baber Baz and the team of MP Jess Philips in attendance.

The event started with a brief introduction to the emerging Forum and Plan and attendees were invited to give feedback and connect with members of the team for feedback and engagement.

The event was marketed heavily on social media including Facebook and Twitter and the official website. The event was also covered by local news organisations and received positive press coverage on Pakistani and Somalian TV and Radio channels. See the link below.

6th October 2023 at SALAMA centre

With the kind assistance of the representatives from the Small Heath/Bordesley Green Somalian and Eritrean community and of Dr Qaarey of the Salama Somalian Advice Centre, a drop-in session was held. This event was specifically aimed at engaging with Small Heath's large and growing Somalian and Eritrean community and was multi-lingual session, promoted on Roja radio, Birmingham's only Somalian station and located in Small Heath.

1st & 2nd November 2023 Online Event

For those who were unable to attend any of live events we arranged for 2 online drop-in events. They were marketed on the website and Facebook and were attended by members of the public online. Key themes discussed were: What is a Neighbourhood Plan? What does it involve? and How to get involved? Discussions were assisted by technical support and attendance from AECOM.

11th and 25th July 2023 - Ladies only drop-in sessions at Love Chai: Team member Shreen Mahmood hosted a series of coffee morning sessions at the Chaii wala at the St. Andrews Bordesley Green Shopping Park. She held women's only session that catered particularly for

local South Asian women who felt more comfortable at a ladies only session. The sessions were advertised on Instagram and helped capture and engage a group who can often be at risk of being under-represented.

30th September 2024 at the Sultan Hall, Whitemore Road Small Heath.

Emerging forum members hosted a Small Heath Neighbourhood Plan Community Iftati event from 6 -8pm at the Sultan Hall in Small Heath. The event was a successful evening with many residents and stakeholders in attendance. Stakeholders who attended included representatives from West Midlands Police, Trading Standards, community group Inspire CIC based on Coventry Road, Birmingham City Councillor Ayoub Khan, Al-Rahman Mosque imam and delegates, and local stakeholders and residents.

The event started with a brief introduction to the emerging Forum and Plan and attendees were invited to break their fast and share in a community meal. Attendees were later invited to give feedback and connect with members of the pre-Forum team for feedback and engagement after the breaking of the fast.

The event was marketed on social media including Facebook and Twitter and was also covered by local news organisations. It received positive press coverage on community and Somalian TV and Radio channels (see the link below).
