Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 160

- The network of paths in, and around the edges of, the churchyard of St Philips were first recorded in 1839 when six of the paths (namely 5 around the edge and one on the north side of the church) were closed. These closed sections all started and finished on the remaining paths, thereby establishing that they were also public rights of way. (The Quarter Sessions Highways Order is held by Warwickshire County Record Office under reference QS32/2 Mich. 1839 and was confirmed on 14 May 1839.)
- 2 The remaining paths, namely those the subject of this application, all have well maintained surfaces and fingerposts at each end with a 'walking man' symbol.
- 3 It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the routes subsist as public footpaths and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
