

Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 284

- The path is first recorded, and labelled "Foot Road", on the map with the Kings Norton (Rednall Yield) Tithe Apportionment 1840. (Held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library.)
- The path is shown, and labelled 'FP', on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1880's).
- The western half (either side of Bodenham Road) was diverted by a Quarter Sessions Highways Order, with a Certificate of viewing of 25 July 1933. (Held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library, Archives section, at OS/B/21/1 (Box 14, Bundle 1, item 8).)
- Only the eastern part of the path is recorded on the (undated) City Council map of public rights of way.
- The path now consists of a pavement at School Close (off Bristol Road South), with the remainder having a tarmac surface.
- It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
