Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 286

- 1 The path is first shown, and labelled "Foot Road", on the plan with the Kings Norton (Rednall Yield) Tithe Apportionment of 1840. (Held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library.)
- 2 The path is shown, and labelled 'FP', on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1880's).
- 3 The south-west half is shown, coloured green, on the Ordnance Survey 'Pathfinder' map (sheet 954) of 1988, where the green colour depicts a public footpath. (The information will have been taken from the original Worcestershire Definitive Map, which was subsequently reviewed to the present Local Authority boundaries, and the paths re-numbered.)
- 4 The path is recorded on the (undated) City Council map of public rights of way.
- 5 It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
