

Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 255

- The path is first recorded on the map with the Northfield Tithe Apportionment of 1840. (Held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library.)
- The path is shown, and labelled 'FP', on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1880's).
- The north-western two thirds is shown on the Ordnance Survey Pathfinder map (sheet 933) of 1990 as a public footpath, the information having been taken from the relevant Definitive Map for Worcestershire.
- The south-east end of this recorded section has been lost under the modern housing estate, although the Ordnance Survey map shows a passageway nearby. No Diversion Order has been found either for this part or the continuation to the next road.
- The path is recorded (in part) on the (undated) City Council map of public rights of way.
- It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
