



Channel 4 Documentary with Birmingham Children's Trust – 2025

Channel 4 is producing a current affairs documentary following frontline social workers from Birmingham Children's Trust, to provide an accurate portrayal of their work, alongside Trust staff, external safeguarding partners and the families they support.

The documentary aims to highlight the realities of social work today, the complexity of decision-making and the vital role of multi-agency safeguarding.

If a social worker is filmed working with a child from your setting, and your staff may be involved, the film team will aim to provide advance notice and seek consent for their participation.

Two experienced filmmakers: Rhi MacDonald and Carrie Slinn are filming social workers across **Prebirth, Safeguarding and Assessment and Short-Term Intervention teams**, who respond to initial referrals which have met the threshold for statutory intervention. They will sensitively follow involvement with families, predominantly of children under 5.

True Vision Productions have a Filming Access Agreement and Data Sharing Agreement with Birmingham Children's Trust.

Family participation will be sought through a two-stage informed consent process, with additional safeguards for vulnerable individuals, with anonymity where required. The team follows strict duty of care and consent practices, and the Trust will review the documentary to ensure the best interests of children are upheld.

This is an opportunity to show school's invaluable role in the day-to-day safeguarding of our children, and the team is hopeful for support in being able to show this.

The film is being made with the support of the Family Division Presiding Judge for the Midlands, Mrs Justice Lieven, and the Designated Family Judge in Birmingham HHJ Sybil Thomas is being kept updated.
