

Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 208

- The path is first recorded on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1880's), when it followed two tracks, in part, with a link between.
- The northern end of the path was diverted onto a new street (The Worthings) with a short section south-east of the railway also being diverted by a Quarter Sessions Highways Order of 1920, with a Certificate of Completion dated 14 April 1921. (Order held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library, Archives section, at QS/B/21/1 (Box 14, Bundle 3, item 30).)
- The section south-east from Allens Croft Road was diverted by a Quarter Sessions Highways Order of 1922, the new length being 102 yards, with a Certificate of Completion dated 28 June 1922. (Order at QS/B/21/1 (Box 14, Bundle 2, item 31).)
- A small section at Brandwood Park Road and Lifford Close was diverted by a Quarter Sessions Highways Order of 1947, with a Certificate of Completion dated 17 January 1949. (Order at QS/B/21/3 (Box 16, item 7).)
- The minutes of the Public Works Committee of the City Council, for January to March 1949, describes the path (Report No.8 under minute No.27021) as going from Allens Croft Road to Tunnel Lane. (Held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library at BCC/AO.)
- The section from Rea Side Crescent/Lifford Close to the canal was diverted by a Quarter Sessions Highways Order of 1952, with a Certificate of Completion dated 21 May 1854. The Order included the creation of a length of the new path along the canal towpath for 37 yards (i.e. to meet the original line of the path), and labels the distance to Tunnel Lane as 120 yards. (Order at QS/B/21/6 (Box 17, item 1).)
- This last section of diverted path, namely from Lifford Close to the canal, was partly closed by The Stopping up of Highways (City of Birmingham)(No.4) Order 2005, which was made on 16th March 2005. The gap from the retained end of the path to the canal was replaced by the estate road (now called Cressy Close) and footpaths being formally adopted.
- All the remaining sections of the path, to the canal, are shown on the (undated) City Council map of public rights of way.
- It is considered, therefore, that the remaining sections of the path, and the canal towpath, subsist as public paths and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
