

Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 279

- The path is first recorded on the map with the Northfield Tithe Apportionment of 1840. (Copy held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library.)
- The path is shown on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1880's).
- The path is shown as a passageway on the Ordnance Survey 'Pathfinder' map (sheet 954) of 1988, although the south-west end is shown as having been diverted from its original route. (No Highways Order has been found for this diversion.)
- 4 The path is recorded on the (undated) City Council map of public rights of way.
- 5 It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
