

# Voter ID - Information

## Voter ID

You need to show photo identification (ID) to be able to vote in person at a polling station at all elections in England.

### Which forms of ID can I use to vote?

You may already have a form of photo ID that is acceptable. You can use any of the following:

- Passport
- Driving licence (including provisional license)
- Blue badge
- Certain concessionary travel cards
- Identity card with PASS mark (Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- Biometric Immigration document
- Defence identity card
- Certain national identity cards

You will only need to show one form of photo ID, but it needs to be the original version and not a photocopy. Out of date ID is also acceptable, as long as the photo is still a good likeness. The name on your ID must be the same name you used to register to vote.

### If you don't have an accepted form of photo ID

If you don't already have an accepted form of photo ID, or you're not sure whether your photo ID still looks like you, you can apply for a free voter ID document, known as a **Voter Authority Certificate**. You can apply for this at [voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk](http://voter-authority-certificate.service.gov.uk).

Alternatively, you can complete a paper application form and send this to your local Electoral Registration Officer.

The deadline to apply for a Voter Authority Certificate is 5pm 6 working days before an election. You can check the deadline for a specific election by looking at the City Council's website.
