### Care to Dance – Bringing Joy, Confidence and Connection Through Movement

Discover the transformative power of dance for care-experienced young people!

#### **Home | Care to Dance**

Care to Dance is more than a dance programme - it's a safe, inclusive space where young people can express themselves, build confidence, and create lasting friendships. Every step, every beat, and every smile contributes to a sense of belonging and wellbeing.

#### What is Care to Dance?

Care to Dance is a trauma-informed initiative designed specifically for care-experienced children and young people. The mission is simple yet powerful:

Empower through movement - Dance becomes a tool for self-expression and emotional release.

Build confidence and leadership - Participants aged 12+ can gain accredited Level 1 and Level 2 Dance Leadership Qualifications.

Create community - Weekly sessions, social events, and celebration performances foster connection and joy

All sessions are led by trained dance teachers and supported by a social worker, ensuring a nurturing environment for every participant.

#### Why Join Care to Dance?

Dance isn't just fun - it's life-changing. Research shows that dance improves physical health, mental wellbeing, confidence, and social skills. It helps young people process emotions, develop resilience, and feel part of a supportive community.





#### Programme Highlights

Inclusive Dance Workshops: Explore different genres every week - from street to contemporary. Leadership Opportunities: Older participants can take on ambassador roles and gain work experience.

Celebration Events: Showcase your achievements at our end-of-year performances.

Fully Funded Places: Thanks to Birmingham Virtual School and partners, there's no cost for Birmingham Children in Care.

#### When and Where?

Birmingham: Weekly dance workshops are held every Tuesday evening at the ACE Space, 54-57 Floodgate Street, Birmingham, B5 5SL.
Other Locations: Care to Dance also runs programmes in Dudley and Sandwell for young people who live closer to those areas.

Referral by Social Worker: The young person's social worker completes the referral form (including child and carer details, emergency contacts, and any relevant medical information).

#### Booking:

Serco will issue a membership number to the carer, who can then book lessons at their nearest BCIT Leisure Centre.

#### Attendance:

The carer must remain on-site during lessons. Regular attendance is essential to complete the block. Each child can access the offer once.

# Make a Splash! Free Swimming Lessons for Children in Care

Eligibility applies.

Birmingham Virtual School, in partnership with Serco and Birmingham Community Leisure Trust, is delighted to offer an exciting opportunity: 10 free swimming lessons for Birmingham Children in Care (CiC) across the city. This initiative is designed to help children build water confidence, develop vital life skills, and have fun in a safe, supportive environment.

#### What's on Offer?

10 Free Swimming Lessons: Each lesson is 30 minutes, delivered weekly over 10 consecutive weeks at Birmingham Community Leisure Trust (BCLT) centres operated by Serco.

Mainstream Swimming Programme: Children will join group sessions led by qualified instructors, focusing on water safety and swimming skills.

Recognition: Badges and certificates are awarded for achievements during the block.

Additional Benefits: After the free block, families can access a 20% discount on future lessons via Passport to Leisure, enjoy the first month free when signing up for a Direct Debit membership, and pay no admin fee for new memberships.

#### Who is Eligible?

Children in Care (CiC) supported by Birmingham Virtual School. Main Cohort: Pre-Reception, Reception, and Year 1 (ages 1–6), with a focus on building water confidence before school swimming lessons

Additional Cohort: Young people new to care, including Unaccompanied Asylum Seekers (UASC) and newly arrived children who cannot swim.

#### Why Swimming?

Swimming is a vital life skill that builds confidence, improves physical and mental health, and opens the door to lifelong enjoyment of water activities. For children in care, it's also a chance to make friends, gain recognition, and experience success outside the classroom.

#### Spaces Are Limited - Apply Now!

# WMVS CiC Foundation Events

## Celebrating Success: The WMVS CiC Foundation Podcast Workshop

Welcome to WMVS Children In Care Foundation
The WMVS Children in Care Foundation recently
hosted a highly successful Podcast Workshop on
Tuesday, 28th October 2025, bringing together
young people aged 11–18 from across Birmingham,
Sandwell, Dudley, Wolverhampton, and Walsall
Virtual Schools. Held at The Hollies Steps Centre in
Smethwick, the workshop provided a unique and
supportive environment for children in care to
explore the world of podcasting.

Participants were guided through every stage of podcast creation, including:
Brainstorming and developing ideas
Writing scripts
Recording and editing audio
Publishing their own podcasts

No prior experience was necessary - just enthusiasm and a willingness to share stories. The workshop was inclusive, catering to a wide range of interests such as music, gaming, sports, and general conversation.

Feedback from the event was overwhelmingly positive. Young people enjoyed having their voices heard and learning new skills, while carers and staff praised the workshop's engaging and confidence-building atmosphere. One of the staff members shared "It was lovely to see all the young people getting involved in the podcast activities and creating their own podcasts, it really felt like an achievement for them. They were all really inspired". The success of this event has sparked interest in future podcast sessions and creative opportunities, with the WMVS CiC Foundation and BVS looking to offer ongoing support for budding young podcasters.

#### SFE Music | Home Page | Birmingham

Birmingham Virtual School, in partnership with Services For Education, has been providing high-quality 1:1 instrumental and vocal music lessons for children in care for several years. This offer is designed to support personal progression, achievement, and wellbeing through music, and is open to children in care from Year 4 to Year 11 attending Birmingham schools.

#### What's Included?

Fully funded lessons for Year 4 and Year 7, including instrument loan.

50% subsidised lessons for other years (schools can use Pupil Premium Plus for the remainder). Wide choice of instruments: brass, strings, woodwind, percussion, and voice.

Qualified teachers following the national curriculum and safeguarding standards.

Young people can join at any point in the school year, whether they're beginners or experienced. Music Service Teachers aim to be as flexible as possible with lesson times and instrument choices, though not all requests can always be accommodated due to scheduling and resources. Please note: Referrals made before Christmas will be set up after January.

#### Other Details

Regional Access: Thanks to reciprocal agreements, children in care from other local authorities attending Birmingham schools can also access the offer. For Birmingham children in care attending schools outside the city, lessons are arranged with the relevant Virtual School in that area.

Attendance and Progress: Schools are expected to monitor attendance and support regular participation. The aim is to increase confidence, resilience, and provide opportunities for awards, recognition, and group music-making.

Older students can also access performance opportunities through the Birmingham Youth Proms and city ensembles.

#### Winner Up! Celebrating Success

A highlight of the year is the "Winner Up!" annual music showcase held each Summer at the Midland Arts Centre (MAC) Birmingham. This event gives young musicians the chance to perform in a professional setting, work with experienced musicians, and share their achievements with family and friends.

Birmingham Virtual School and Services For Education are currently working to set up the next Winner Up! event, which will take place in summer next year.

An exciting update for the Winner Up! event is that we are introducing two days: one day dedicated to primary-aged young people and one day dedicated to secondary school young people. We plan to finalise the details shortly, so keep an eye out for further updates and information on how to sign up.

Last summer's Winner Up! event was a great success, with young people and families thoroughly enjoying the experience - especially the DJ workshop, which proved to be a real highlight.
