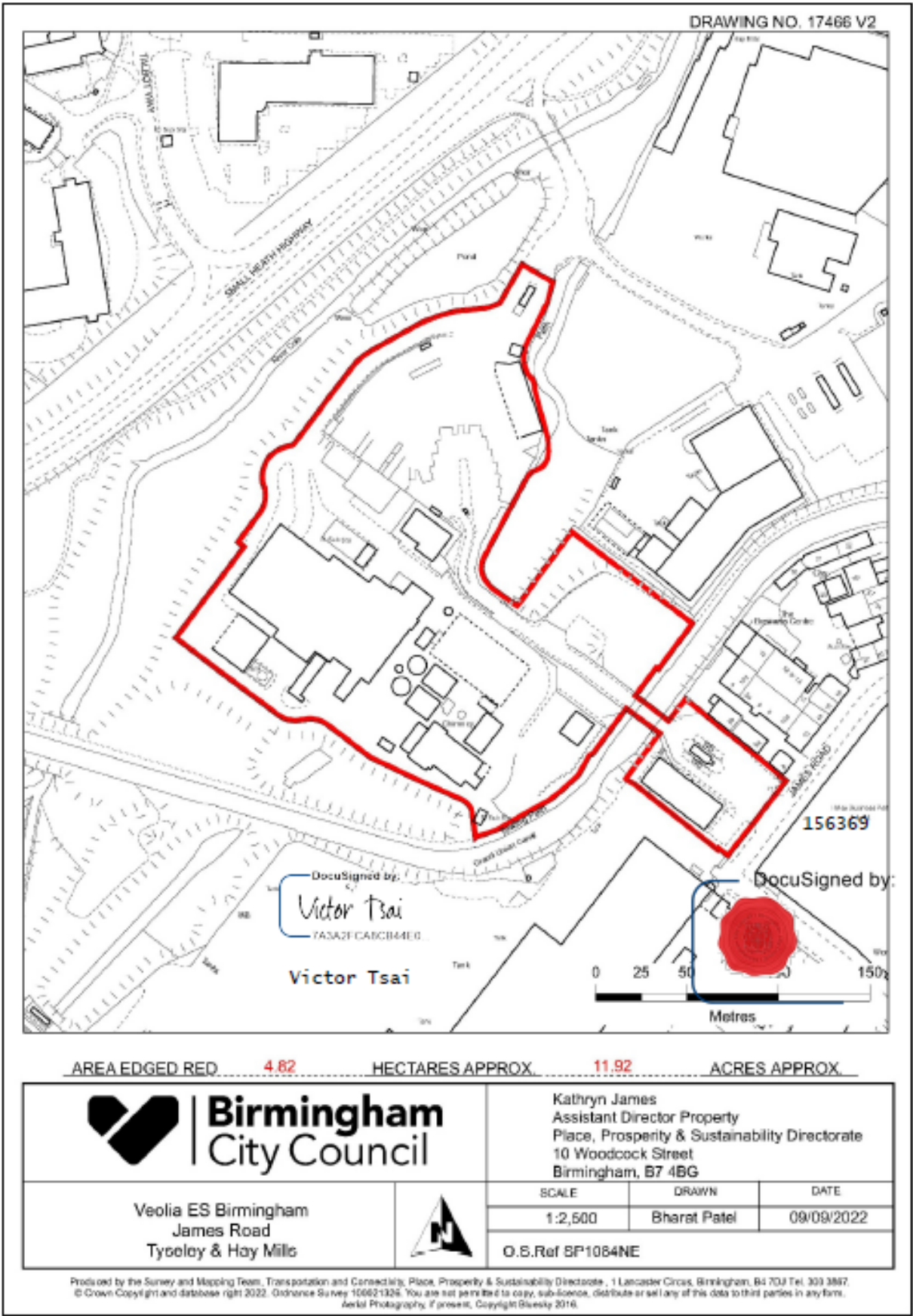
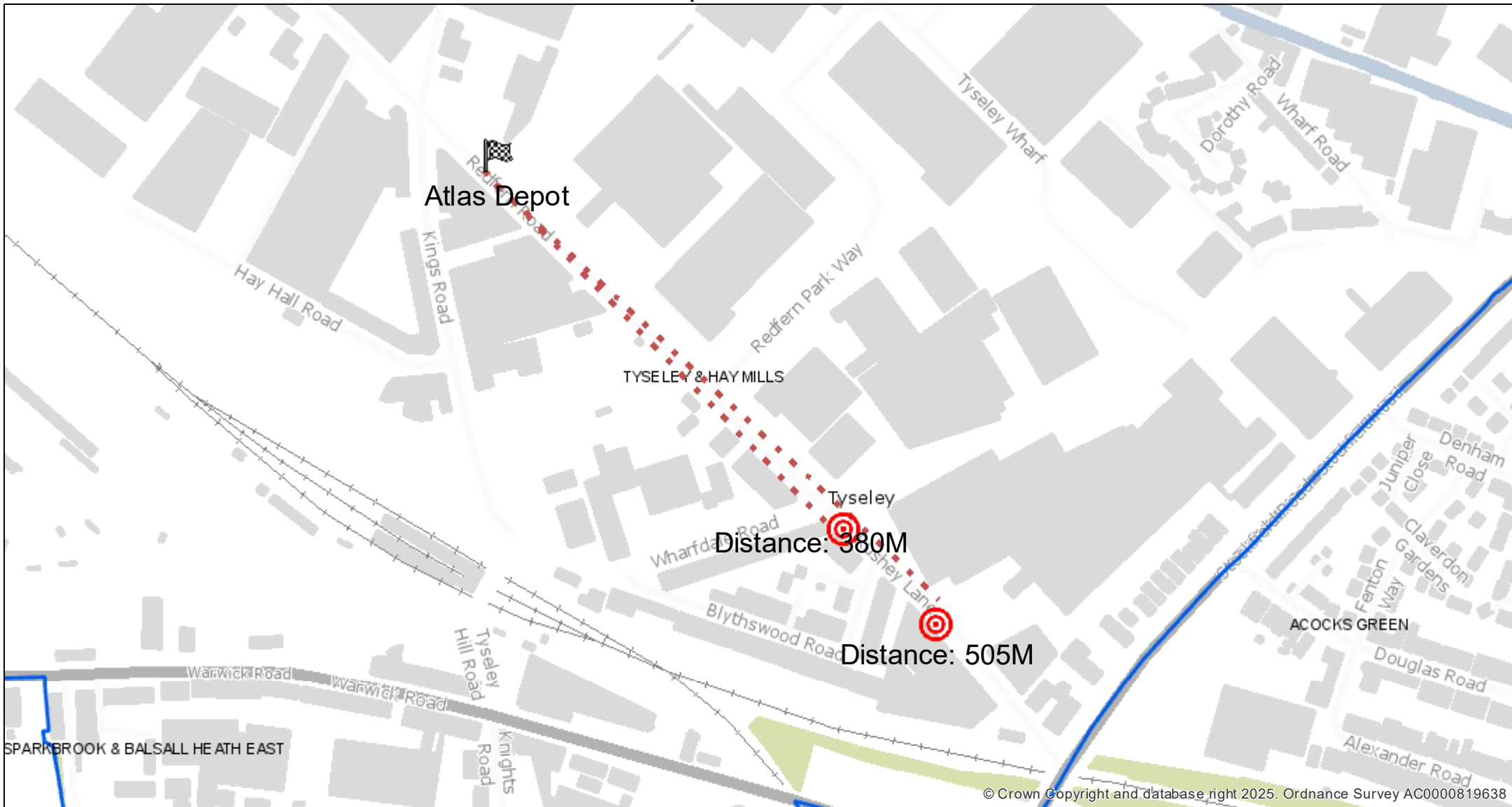

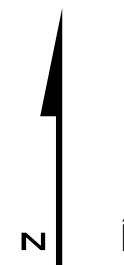

Wednesday 17th September 2025

Daily Operational Sit Rep

8:30am morning update:

1. Morning deployment from depots:

Atlas and support depots: 38 vehicles deployed from Atlas and alternative depots; this includes 4 Trade vehicle. 11 Coventry crews deployed.

There is no official picket at the depot this morning however there were approximately 30 protestors at the Kings Road entrance to the depot.

In addition to these protestors, there were approximately 8 activists wearing face masks at the crossroad junction of Redfern Road, Kings Road and Rushey Lane blockading the refuse vehicles from proceeding. The protestors dispersed at 8:00am. Whilst Police were onsite, we are still awaiting a debrief in regard to how the situation was handled. From viewing the vehicle footage, it would appear that the Police instructed BCC vehicles to move off the highway and not block oncoming traffic, however they continued to allow the protestors to maintain their blockade. BCC are keen to meet with WMP so they can ensure a fair and transparent approach to Policing was shown to both sides.

Smithfield: 32 vehicles deployed and 3 crews from Coventry.

There are no pickets or protestors at Smithfield Depot. There is 1 official picket at Lifford Lane depot this morning, although none of them were wearing hi-vis. There are approximately 30 individuals behind the fenced off areas outside of Lifford Lane Depot. This information is based on manager's morning observations and can be subject to change throughout the day.

Perry Barr: 23 vehicles deployed. 10 contractor crews from Coventry.

There is no official picket at the depot this morning. There are approximately 30 protestors at Perry Barr Depot behind the fenced off area. There are no other individuals present at the depot this morning outside of official picket/fenced off area. This information is based on manager's morning observations and can be subject to change throughout the day.

**Total number of waste collection vehicles deployed today so far: 9
BCC vehicles including 4 Trade and 24 for Coventry; 115 in total.**

1. Morning deployment from depots:

Atlas and support depots: 37 vehicles deployed from Atlas and alternative depots; this includes 3 Trade vehicles. 11 Coventry crews deployed.

There is no official picket at the depot this morning however there were approximately 30 protestors at the Kings Road entrance to the depot. There were masked protestors assembled at Redfern Road junction with Rushey lane, however disruption was avoided as the crews were redirected to an alternative route.

Smithfield: 32 vehicles deployed and 3 crews from Coventry.

There are no pickets or protestors at Smithfield Depot. There is 1 official picket at Lifford Lane depot this morning, although none of them were wearing hi-vis. There are approximately 30/40 individuals behind the fenced off areas outside of Lifford Lane Depot. This information is based on manager's morning observations and can be subject to change throughout the day.

Perry Barr: 23 vehicles deployed. 10 contractor crews from Coventry.

There is no official picket at the depot this morning. There are approximately 30 protestors at Perry Barr Depot behind the fenced off area. There are no other individuals present at the depot this morning outside of official picket/fenced off area. This information is based on manager's morning observations and can be subject to change throughout the day.

Total number of waste collection vehicles deployed today so far: 92 BCC vehicles including 4 Trade and 24 for Coventry; 116 in total.

No, due to protesters blockading vehicles and the service is still behind with container collections.

What is the overall level of residual waste?

93% of scheduled collections (Wednesday 17th September) have been made, this was due to protesters blockading vehicles at Atlas depot.

8:30am morning update:

1. Morning deployment from depots:

Atlas and support depots: As of 08:30 am, 20 vehicles have deployed from alternative depots; 18 Coventry crews deployed. No vehicles have been deployed from Atlas depot. There is a protest on Redfern Road (see image below). The protesters are stopping the vehicles from deploying by blocking the exit on Redfern Road. Police are in attendance.

On Kings Road there is a picket with no picket supervisor with approx. 50 plus protesters.



Smithfield: 32 vehicles deployed. There are no pickets or protestors at Smithfield depot. There is no picket at Lifford Lane depot, however, there are approx. 40 protestors in attendance. All crews deployed safely by 06:35 am.

Perry Barr: 22 vehicles deployed; 7 contractor crews from Coventry. There is an official picket at the depot this morning and there are approximately 30/40 protestors at the depot. As of 08:00 am additional

protesters arrived outside the depot, taking the number up to approx. 60 plus.

Total number of waste collection vehicles deployed today so far: 99 including 74 BCC vehicles and 25 for Coventry.

8:30am morning update:

1. Morning deployment from depots:

Atlas and supporting depots: 18 vehicles have been deployed from Atlas and alternative depots; 18 Coventry crews deployed. There is a picket on Redfern Road and there are approx. 50 Unite protesters. There are also approx. 9 activists from The Socialist Workers Party on Redfern Road that are separate to the Unite protesters. The activists are actively walking in front of the deployment gate stopping vehicles from leaving the depot. West Midlands Police were called at 06:35am, they attended the depot at 07:26am and engaged with the picket lines and then disappeared without engaging with Birmingham City Council.

As of 08:30am, 18 vehicles have deployed from the depot, these were deployed at 04:00am, the remaining 16 vehicles that deploy at 06:00am have been unable to leave the depot. There are also 6 Street Cleansing vehicles that are unable to deploy.

There is no picket on Kings Road, however there are 6 activists from The Socialist Workers Party continually walking in front of the depot entrance on Kings Road wearing masks

Smithfield: 31 vehicles deployed. There is a picket at Lifford depot this morning however there are approx. 40 protesters. There is no picket Smithfield depot. All vehicles deployed safely by 06:35 am.

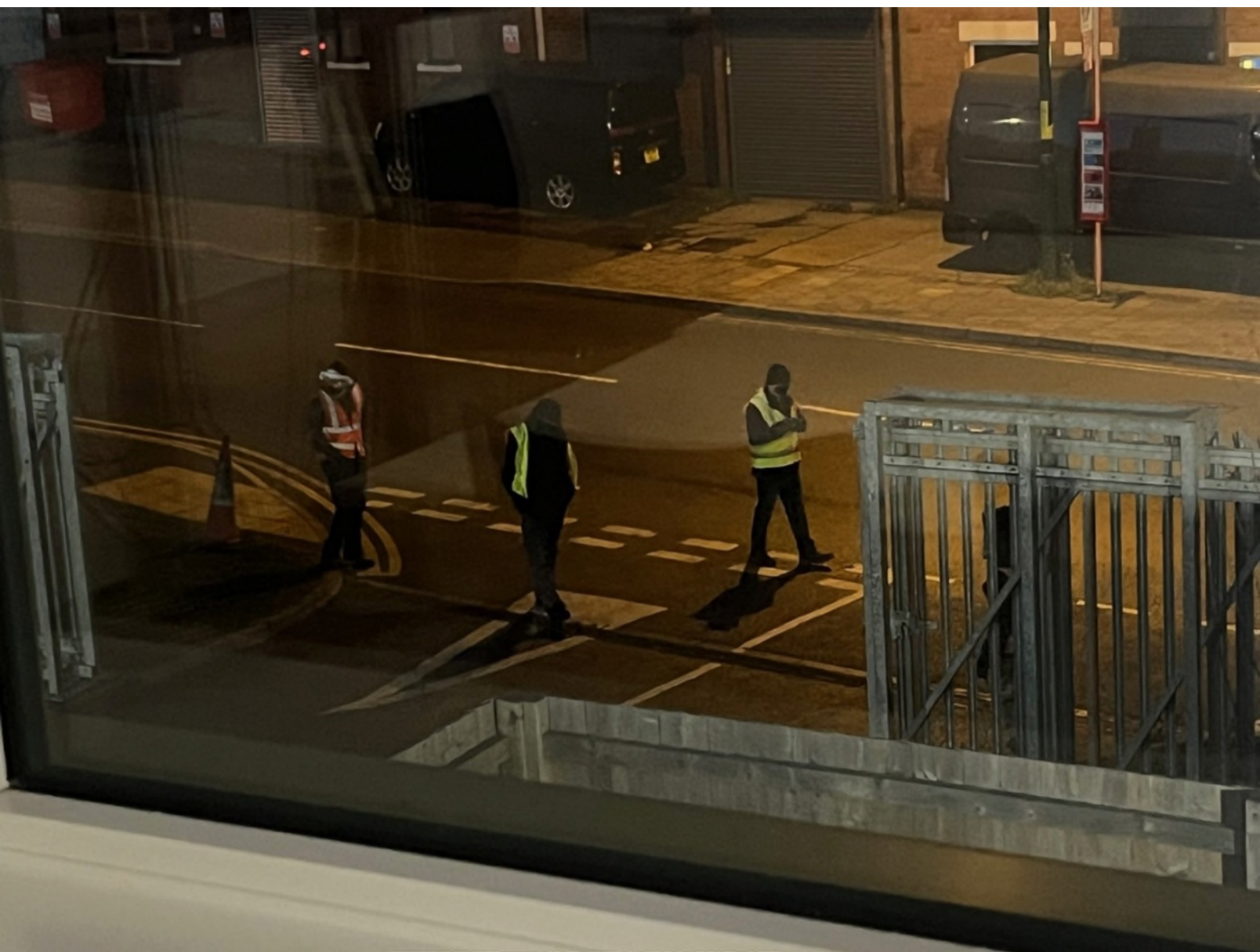

More pictures from the direct action on Tuesday in which community activists protested in front of the big wagons in support of the striking bin workers.

Bin workers in Birmingham have been on all-out strike since March, fighting the council's proposed deletion of the critical health and safety role, forcing workers in the role to take a wage cut of up to £8000 a year.

Meanwhile, the commissioners introduced by the Tories to help the council implement cuts are making over £1000 a day. Kier Starmer could have kicked these commissioners out on day one as Prime Minister but chose not to.

Now, even the agency staff who were being used to undermine the strike have voted to go on strike due to bullying and harassment. The agency staff's strike officially begins this Monday (Dec 1st).

8:30am morning update:

1. Morning deployment from depots:

Atlas and supporting depots: 18 vehicles have been deployed from Atlas and alternative depots; 20 Coventry crews deployed. There are currently 15 vehicles that have been blockaded since 6am this morning. At 9am we are currently still blockaded in the depot.

Smithfield: 29 vehicles deployed; 2 Coventry crews deployed. There is no picket at Lifford depot today. There is a picket at Smithfield depot today and there are approx. 30/40 protesters. All vehicles deployed safely by 06:30 am.

Perry Barr: 22 vehicles deployed; 9 Coventry crews deployed. There is no picket at the depot this morning however there are approx. 30/40 protesters. There was some verbal abuse from a distance with chants of "I would rather be a picket than a scout" as the vehicles left the depot but no blockages. All vehicles deployed safely by 07:00 am.

Total number of waste collection vehicles deployed today so far: 80 including 49 BCC vehicles and 31 for Coventry.

1 x MHRC running seven days a week.

2. Opening hours of the Household Waste & Recycling Centres: continued extended opening hours in operation: Kings Norton 07.00 - 21:00, weekends 08:00-18:00 and other centres 08.00 until 18:00 weekdays and 08:00-16:30 weekends. Showing 52% booked for Friday 5th December, 39% booked for Saturday 6th December and 29% booked for Sunday 7th December.

How much waste has been collected by weight?

1336 tonnes collected at kerbside; 133 tonnes collected at the HWRC.

Did we deliver the planned activity in the day?

No.

What is the overall level of residual waste?

37% of scheduled collections (Thursday 4th December). This was due to ‘Mega Picket 3’. The City’s strategic management team authorised the suspension of services on 01.12.2025 on Health and Safety grounds. We will continue to collect a day behind until the City’s collections are caught up.

Additional resource is being deployed over the weekend to try and ensure the impact of the blockade at Atlas is mitigated and therefore all scheduled collections are completed.
