Subject: Blockading at Birmingham City Council Depot - 15th January 2026

Good morning gents,

I am conscious that there is a requirement within the Council to report daily deployment through the Sitrep report. As such I thought it might be useful to provide a summary and confirm how the blockade was managed today.

Blockading was reported at Smithfield depot at 06:04 and at Atlas Depot at 06:09. The incidents were immediately reported to via 111 and crime references were provided. The police response was swift and at both depots we police were on site within the hour.

At Smithfield the police managed to 'negotiate' with the protestors that vehicles would be allowed to leave every 15 minutes. The protestors adhered to this deal and allowed vehicles to leave every 15 minutes. Police remained on site until 09:00 whereby they facilitated the release of all vehicles in accordance with the Ziegler 'agreement' that protestors can only be on site for 3 hours.

At Atlas the police attended but were not able to negotiate the early release of the vehicles with the protestors. We asked if the vehicles could be released at 09:00 but the police advised they were not prepared to support this request and agreed with the protestors that vehicles would be released at 10:00 as the protestors had to leave at this time. I did escalate the situation and explain I had agreed the 3-hour timeline with Silver Command. Unfortunately, the police on site at Atlas were not prepared to support this request.

Thank you for your email dated 16th January 2026 whereby you outline your concerns relating to Birmingham City Council bin lorries being unable to leave depots.

West Midlands Police continue to work closely with Birmingham City Council to mitigate disruption to both employees and members of the public, while appropriately balancing the right to lawful picketing and industrial action. I met with colleagues from Birmingham City Council last week to discuss the ongoing concerns that council officers had raised.

Chief Inspector Grandison from Birmingham Local Policing Area is the designated local policing lead and will continue liaising with Birmingham City Council to ensure that any response to emerging issues remains proportionate and appropriate. He is also responsible for ensuring the appropriate deployment of policing resources, based on current information and intelligence.

Further meetings are planned for next week which will include council officers. If you think a meeting with a meeting between ourselves would be productive, please let me know and we can make suitable arrangements.

Colleagues ,

Following my earlier correspondence and in light of recent external commentary from Councillor Majid Mahmood, Birmingham City Council's Cabinet Member for Environment and Transport, I wanted to provide clarity around the agreed operational approach for Op Dusker.

Response Inspectors and the FIMs remain the first operational decision makers on the ground, with their role being critical in ensuring the approach is applied consistently and with confidence.

The current resourcing model comprises four Birmingham officers and as well as one sergeant and two officers from the wider force on a rota basis, secured via a 90-day notice. We have, at times, stood these down a week in advance where demand has allowed, and that may happen again as the operational picture allows. Where resources have been stood down, Response officers will form the default attendance if there is a genuine requirement for police presence. Please ensure this is clearly understood and covered within your briefings.

Our officer expectations, which should form the basis of local briefings, are as follows:

WMP will attend each time officers are requested.

On arrival, officers must:

- Meet the site manager at the gatehouse for a handover and briefing.
- Engage with protesters to understand intentions and maintain dialogue.

Officers must balance the right to protest with Birmingham City Council's right to conduct lawful business. Officers should remain mindful of the Ziegler ruling, which confirms that protest is a protected right and that some disruption is lawful. However, disruption must remain proportionate.

Once disruption becomes excessive, prolonged, or prevents lawful business from continuing, police

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intervention becomes justified.

It has been agreed with Birmingham City Council that three hours is a general benchmark for acceptable disruption before officers should begin actively considering escalation options.

Throughout engagement, officers must:

- Use the five-step appeal process.
- Capture evidence of disruption, behaviour and engagement on BWV.

Once the tipping point is reached:

- Officers must move to the final appeal stage, and this must be recorded on BWV.

Where offences are identified, officers must consider appropriate action, including obstruction of the highway, aggravated trespass or breach of the peace. Disposal may include summons or arrest, depending on the circumstances.

I would ask that any meaningful developments, emerging risks, flashpoints or changes to the operational picture are fed back to me so that I can maintain appropriate oversight.

We have a meeting with Birmingham City Council next month to develop a Memorandum of Understanding between WMP and BCC and I'll update you all with any meaningful changes to the above.

BH Planning, please ensure this approach remains embedded within nomination and briefing processes.

Insp's - please ensure you staff are appropriately briefed and understand the expectations and guidance .

Thank you for your email. I also note that you wrote to me on the 22nd January 2025 at 13:00 and as yet I have not replied. I have therefore taken the liberty of responding to both emails within this correspondence.

Meeting with Assistant Chief Constable Ian Parnell

The City Council does not agree that an outcome of the meeting was that Birmingham City Council would explore ‘a number of vulnerabilities’ identified within the current injunction regulating to picketing and protest activity. The City Council has always been clear on what is covered under the injunction as has the Court including during the recent contempt proceedings. We have now reached a point however where the recent 'protesting' activity is making it increasingly difficult for the Council to maintain service to the residents of Birmingham who have paid for and are entitled to have their household waste collected. To that end, the Council is now considering a further application to

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the court brought against 'persons unknown' who are responsible for the blockading of Council vehicles. With that in mind, I am asking you to provide the names of any individuals that the police is aware of and who have been involved in that activity. This is so that those persons can be added as named Defendants to any application that the Council makes for an injunction to restrain the current unsustainable levels of 'protest' activity. We anticipate issuing proceedings within the next 7 days and therefore an urgent response would be appreciated.

Email 23rd January 2026

I note from your internal email that you reference 'agreed operational approach for Op Dusker'. The City Council would like to reiterate the position it stated at the meeting on the 13th January 2026 which is that 'We do not agree that 3 hours is a general benchmark'.

At the meeting we challenged **the police's position** and were advised by ACC Ian Parnell that it was the **police's** interpretation of Ziegler that 3 hours was reasonable. For the avoidance of doubt the City Council has not agreed to a three-hour delay in operational deployment nor does it agree that 3 hours is reasonable in the circumstances noting the serious risk to the public's health and safety if the City's waste is not collected.

The Memorandum of Understanding that has been shared with WMP was drafted as a last resort to reflect the imposition of the **police's** interpretation of Ziegler and does not reflect the City Council's position which was and remains that this is unreasonable. It is noted that, despite a commitment from WMP to do so, no comments have been received.

Finally, the City Council is disappointed that WMP has chosen to adopt a revised operational response to Op. Dusker. It is the City Council's belief that such is the severity of the situation that the well-established senior leadership response should be maintained. The Council would urge WMP to reconsider their position given the potential impact blockading the City Council refuse collection vehicles will have.

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Afternoon Ian,

Thank you for taking time out to speak this morning regarding the challenges we are facing with protestors and activists blocking vehicles at our waste depots.

I have set out our record of this morning events below.

1. Sergeant Adam Hill contacted Chris to discuss the police response this morning. From that conversation it was clear that he was not fully briefed or aware of the history of the ongoing dispute. He suggested that we had 2 factions of protestors today, those from Unite and the other been angry residents who have not received a bin collection. I would strongly question this view as it was evident from the CCTV footage we have obtained that banners linking the protestors to the socialist workers party are visible as well as observing several pro-Palestinian flags.
2. He also advised that the police would be moving away from the council's agreed timeline of 3 hours protesting. He was advised that was not the council position and this has previously been challenged. He then informed us that he had negotiated a position with the protestors which effectively would see vehicles realised at intervals of 15 minutes between 6am and 7am, 10 minutes between 7am and 8am and 5 minutes after 9am. This position was not enforced at Perry Barr or Smithfield, and it only was adhered to at Atlas because of the local management.
3. Adam then changed this stance and indicated that all vehicles would be deployed at 10am, with a rationale given that protestors are allowed to cause reasonable disruption!! When pressed on the interpretation of reasonable disruption, Sergeant Hill could not advise on the detail.

It should be noted that Smithfield did deploy at 10am, however this was down to the management team getting an alternative exit opened which caught the protestors off guard.

Can I also advise that Perry Barr depot did not achieve deployment until 10.50am, which over 5 hours after the

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original request for police support was logged.

Following our meeting on the 13th January 2026, Chris sent the MOU on the 15th January setting out our understanding of this meeting making particular reference to an agreed way of managing the protestors. This was based on the conversation we had Jack and yourself setting out the logic of using Zeigler as a guide to managing the protestors.

We await a response to this correspondence and minutes of that meeting.

I appreciate that this is a challenging situation but can we have the agreed position from the police in terms of what we can expect in managing the protestors and deploying the waste collection vehicles.


8:30am morning update:

1. Morning deployment from depots:

Atlas and supporting depots: 33 vehicles have been deployed from Atlas and alternative depots; 20 Coventry crews deployed. There is a picket at the depot this morning with approx. 40 protesters. All vehicles deployed safely by 06:45am.

Smithfield: 28 vehicles deployed; 2 Coventry crews deployed. There is no picket at Lifford depot today and there no protesters. There is a picket at Smithfield depot today and there are approx. 40 protesters. All vehicles deployed safely by 07:10am. Activists were at Smithfield depot at approx. 05:30am, blockading the deployment gate on BCC property. BCC Protesters were in the designated fenced off area and not taking part in the blockading. West Midlands Police were in attendance who aided in walking the activists from BCC property to enable deployment. The protesters were abusive towards all Smithfield staff specifically the depot manager.





Perry Barr: As of 08:30 am, 6 refuse vehicles have been deployed. West Midlands Police have been in attendance and spoke to the activists who were continually walking in front of the gate stopping the vehicles from leaving. This has affected Street Cleansing vehicles also, with only 10 vehicles being deployed. BCC Protesters were in the designated fenced

off area and not taking part in the blockading. The protesters have been verbally abusive towards the management team whilst attempting to deploy.

Total number of waste collection vehicles deployed today so far: 98 including 67 BCC vehicles and 31 for Coventry.

1 x MHRC running seven days a week.

2. Opening hours of the Household Waste & Recycling Centres: continued extended opening hours in operation: Kings Norton 07.00 - 21:00, weekends 08:00-18:00 and other centres 08.00 until 18:00 weekdays and 08:00-16:30 weekends. Showing 69% booked for Friday 12th December, 33% for Saturday 13th December and 25% Sunday 14th December.
