



Daily Operational Sit Rep

8:30am morning update:

1. Morning deployment from depots:

Atlas and supporting depots: 32 vehicles have been deployed from Atlas and alternative depots; 20 Coventry crews deployed. There is no picket at the depot this morning, however there are approx. 40 protesters on Redfern Road. All vehicles deployed safely by 06:30am.

Smithfield: Update at 8:40am – 31 vehicles at Smithfield have been deployed from Smithfield and 2 Coventry crews deployed. There is no picket at Lifford depot today and there no protestors. There is a picket at Smithfield depot this morning, with approx. 80 protesters. Vehicles were being blockaded in this morning by the protesters. Smithfield's Service Manager talked to the lead activist and then the protesters allowed the vehicles to leave the depot only after having a conversation with each driver. Police were on site to support. All vehicles deployed safety by 8:15am.

Perry Barr: 22 vehicles deployed:9 Coventry crews deployed. There is no picket at the depot today however there are approx. 20 protesters. All vehicles deployed safely by 06:30am.

Total number of waste collection vehicles deployed today so far: 116, including 85 BCC vehicles and 31 for Coventry.

1 x MHRC running seven days a week.

2. Opening hours of the Household Waste & Recycling Centres: continued extended opening hours in operation: Kings Norton 07.00 - 21:00, weekends 08:00-18:00 and other centres 08.00 until 18:00 weekdays and 08:00-16:30 weekends. Showing 62% booked for Friday 19th December, 28% Saturday 20th December and 26% for Sunday 21st December.

1. Morning deployment from depots:

Atlas and supporting depots: 31 vehicles have been deployed from Atlas and alternative depots; 20 Coventry crews deployed. There are no picket or protesters at the depot this morning. All vehicles deployed safely by 06:35am.

Smithfield: 30 vehicles at Smithfield have been deployed from Smithfield and 2 Coventry crews deployed. There is no picket at Lifford depot or Smithfield depot today and there are no protesters at both depots. All vehicles deployed safely by 6:30am.

Perry Barr: 22 vehicles deployed; 9 Coventry crews deployed. There is no picket at the depot today or protesters. All vehicles deployed safely by 06:40am.

Total number of waste collection vehicles deployed today so far: 114, including 83 BCC vehicles and 31 for Coventry.

Opening hours of the Household Waste & Recycling Centres: continued extended opening hours in operation: Kings Norton 07.00 - 21:00, weekends 08:00-18:00 and other centres 08.00 until 18:00 weekdays and 08:00-16:30 weekends. 





Daily Operational Sit Rep

8:30am morning update:

1. Morning deployment from depots:

Atlas and supporting depots: 18 BCC vehicles have been deployed from Atlas and alternative depots; 15 Coventry crews deployed. There is a picket on Redfern Road with approx. 30 protesters. As of 08:30am, 17 BCC vehicles are still to be deployed as activists are blocking the entrance on Redfern Road by pigeon walking in front of the gate. Police in attendance as of 08:00am.

Smithfield: 9 BCC vehicles have been deployed from Smithfield; 2 Coventry crews deployed. There is a picket outside Smithfield depot with approx. 100 protesters. As of 08:30am, 21 BCC vehicles are still to be deployed as activists are blocking the entrance on by pigeon walking in front of the gate. Police are in attendance as of 08:00am. There are no pickets or protesters at Lifford depot.

Perry Barr: 22 BCC vehicle have been deployed; 8 Coventry crews deployed. All vehicles deployed safely by 06:45am. There is no picket at the depot however there are approx. 30/40 protesters.

Total number of waste collection vehicles deployed today so far: 74, including 49 BCC vehicles and 25 for Coventry. 38 vehicles are still to be deployed as of 08:30am.

Any missed collections from Thursday 8th January and Friday 9th January 2026 will be collected as a double collection (excess waste taken) on the scheduled day this week. Any missed collections form Monday 12th January will be collected as a double collection (excess waste taken) on Monday 19th January.

1 x MHRC running seven days a week.

2. Opening hours of the Household Waste & Recycling Centres: continued extended opening hours in operation: Kings Norton 07.00 - 21:00, weekends 08:00-18:00 and other centres 08.00 until 18:00 weekdays and 08:00-16:30 weekends. Between 21.12.2025 and 31.01.2026 all Household Waste and Recycling centres have extended opening hours from 07:00am until 21:00pm Monday to Friday and 08:00am until 18:00pm Saturday and Sunday. Booked slots are currently showing 43% for Thursday 15th January and 22% for Friday 16th January.

How much waste has been collected by weight?

1420 tonnes collected at kerbside; 139 tonnes collected at the HWRC

Did we deliver the planned activity in the day?

Yes.

What is the overall level of residual waste?

67 % of scheduled collections (Wednesday 14th January) were made.

Perry Barr and Atlas depot currently have 50% of their Thursday 8th January and Friday 9th January 2026 collections outstanding. They also have 70% of Monday 12th January work outstanding.
