Application Fee You must provide the appropriate fee when the application is submitted, failure to submit the correct fee will result in the application being declared as invalid

<ul> <li>Location Plan</li> <li>All applications must include a location plan which should:</li> <li>Be at a scale of 1:1250 or 1:2500;</li> <li>Show the direction of North and identify sufficient roads and/or buildings on land adjoining the application site to ensure that the exact location of the application is clear</li> <li>Show the application site outlined in red, which includes all land necessary to carry out the proposed development</li> <li>Show any other land owned by the applicant, close to or adjoining the</li> </ul>			
application site, outlined in blue.			
Site Plan (Only required if operational development is taking place) All applications must be submitted with a site plan (sometimes called a block plan) which should:			
<ul> <li>Be at a scale of 1:500 or 1:200; and</li> <li>Show the direction of North and proposed development in relation to the site boundaries and other existing buildings, both on the site and adjacent to it, with dimensions including those to the boundaries.</li> <li>The site plan should also include the following, unless these would not influence or be affected by the proposed development:</li> </ul>

An application for a Certificate of Lawfulness of Proposed Works form should be used to establish whether proposed works to a listed building would be lawful i.e. they would not affect the character of the listed building as a building of special architectural or historic interest and therefore, would not require listed building consent.

NB: Applications for Certificates of Lawfulness of Proposed Works cannot be submitted in respect of works which have already been carried out.

- All buildings, roads and footpaths on land adjoining the site including access arrangements;
- All public rights of way crossing or adjoining the site;
- The position of all trees on the site and those on adjacent land;
- The extent and type of any hard surfacing; and
- The type and height of any boundary treatment including walls or fencing where proposed.

#### **Local Application Requirements**

- Detailed description of the proposed works (including existing and proposed materials and finishes) together with details of those part(s) of the building likely to be affected
- The reasons the applicant thinks they are entitled to a Certificate of Lawfulness of Proposed Works i.e. why they think the proposed works do not affect the special architectural or historic interest of the listed building
- Any other relevant information
- A statement as to the applicant's interest (ownership, tenancy etc) in the listed building(s) and any interest of any other person
- Details of listed building grading if not known, this information can be found in the National Heritage List for England, which is available on English Heritage's website at: (<a href="http://www.english-heritage.org.uk/professional/protection/process/national-heritage-list-for-england/">http://www.english-heritage.org.uk/professional/protection/process/national-heritage-list-for-england/</a>)

#### What you need to prove

It is up to you to provide the proper evidence to show that the proposed works do not require listed building consent.

If we the local planning authority has evidence, or reasonable grounds to believe, that the applicant's claim is not correct, it may refuse to grant a Certificate of Lawfulness of Proposed Works.
