

Redevelopment Update and Invitation to Special Meeting on 12th February 2009

What's Happening?

Birmingham City Council has been working on proposals to improve the neighbourhood at the Meadway and Kent's Moat Recreation Ground.

One of the Council's key objectives is to provide new homes to meet the City's growing population. Our proposals involve the loss of some of the existing recreation ground (up to 20%) to help us to replace homes lost through the demolition of the tower blocks with new high quality homes at a popular location.

Although the size of the park would be reduced, the income generated from the sale of this land for housing would provide much needed funding to improve the remainder of the park. Benefits may include the construction of new footpaths, new planting and seating areas and the provision of new play facilities and improved playing pitches.

Revised Proposals

In May 2008 we held a Public Consultation Event in order to discuss the initial proposals. Following the comments and concerns raised from this meeting, we have put together 3 revised options for Public Consultation. All three options include the following design criteria:

- Minimise the amount of new housing backing onto existing properties
- Majority of the replacement housing to be low-rise dwellings. Taller dwellings would only be proposed on land which was previously occupied by the old tower blocks.
- Maintain/enhance green links into the Recreation Ground from surrounding streets and open spaces.
- Minimise the number of through roads to prevent noisy 'rat runs' and allow for safer, quieter streets. A barrier would also be provided around the perimeter of the park to help prevent unwanted car access from new roads.
- Enable as many new properties as possible to face onto the Recreation Ground to encourage a safer and less vulnerable park and discourage anti-social behaviour.

A Consultative Committee will be holding a special meeting on Thursday 12th February at 6pm at Blakenhale Infant School to discuss the proposals and answer any questions you may have.




Following the meeting and the response from the returned questionnaires, the Ward Councillors & Officers involved will report to the relevant committees who will make their recommendation for the preferred option.


