

### Statement of Evidence for Path Claim BAP 20

- A short section of this path, in the middle, was created by the Sheldon Inclosure Award of 1813, across allotments 62 and 63. (Held by Warwickshire County Record Office at QS75/96.)
- The whole route is shown on the first edition of the Ordnance Survey six inch map (1887).
- The southern part was diverted on to estate roads, with a footpath link from Horrell Road to Fallindale Road, by a Quarter Sessions Highways Order with a Certificate of 30 March 1936. The section north of Brays Road, to Garretts Green Lane, was not affected, except for a short link from Brays Road. (Held by the City Council in the Central Reference Library, Archives section, at QS/B/21/2 (Box 15, item 52).)
- The path is recorded on the Footpaths Map of Warwickshire (Section One) published by the Ramblers Association (Midland Federation) in 1937. A printed note on the map states that "only those tracks, which, from the best information available, are understood to be reputed public ways" are shown on it.
- 5 The footpath link between Garretts Green Lane and Elmay Road was created by a Quarter Sessions Highways Order of 1936, with a Completion Certificate dated 3 May 1960. (Held by the City Council at QS/B/21/2 (Box 15, item 35).)
- Both parts of the route are recorded on the (undated) City Council map of public rights of way.
- The northern section has a tarmac surface, with one bollard, and dropped kerbs at both ends, and is used (unofficially) as a vehicle short cut. The southern section also has a good, tarmac, surface but has concrete bollards at both ends and two, modern, street lights.
- It is considered, therefore, that it is reasonable to allege that the route subsists as a public footpath and should be recorded as such on the Definitive Map.
