Services at this centre

(Growing Older with a Learning Disability and Dementia) – This group provides a specialist service for older adults or people who are living with Dementia. Staff are trained and experienced in supporting older adults and people who are living with early to late Dementia.

How do I get to you?

We have our own transport service. Please phone us for more information. If we do not have transport available for you, there are other ways to get to the centre.

Bus routes from Birmingham City Centre: 952 to Perry Beeches, 28 to Perry Barr bus station.

What activities do you provide?

Arts and crafts activities we provide include:

- how to make greetings cards;
- flower arranging; painting in water colours and pastels and making collages;
- digital photography;
- sewing and knitting;
- reminiscence looking back at the past;

- table-top activities;
- creating a life book;
- nail care;
- · aromatherapy massage; and
- gardening.



Sports and leisure activities we provide include:

- badminton;
- cricket;
- football;
- lawn green bowling;
- dominoes;
- snooker;
- fishing;
- bingo;
- film groups;
- tea dances; and
- Jabadoo music and movement.

Life-skills activities we provide include:

- learning how to prepare and cook meals;
- survival cookery sessions;
- helping with tasks to maintain independence like using domestic equipment;
- other domestic skills, including laying tables and caretaking duties; and healthy eating.

Community activities we provide include:

- going to the theatre or to see musical performances;
- going to the cinema;
- visits to restaurants;
- day trips to places in England and Wales
- looking at what is interesting about our community;
 visiting other learning disabilities centre

Can I choose which activities I want?

Yes you can. We will ask you some questions to find out what activities you are interested in doing.

Who can take part in the activities?

Anyone with a learning disability who has an assessed need can take part in any of our services. You do not need to have any ability, qualifications or experience to try out any activity.



How much will the activities cost me?

The cost of our services will depend on your level of need, what activities you want to do, and when you want to do them. Once we know this we will be able to tell you the cost. We aim to be value for money and offer good support.

Do you sell food and drink at the centre?

Yes there is a canteen with lots of food and drink choices on the menu. If you tell us what you need, we will do our best to cater for you. We also have fridges if you want to bring in your own food.
